



Work speeds along!

The work to Amen corner is progressing well. The new walling is almost complete. Stone is recycled or reused including on site wherever possible.

New railings have been installed. Old photographs showing more substantial railings before they were removed are on display inside the church.

The changes in the layout for the central flower bed have begun and a new green area is starting to take shape in one corner (photo opposite). Work to the Rose Garden is due to commence after the August Bank Holiday.

There have been fragments of human bone (not graves or full skeletons) discovered during the excavation. This is perhaps not surprising, so close to the church. The fragments have been recorded by the assigned professional Archaeologist and reburied as close to the site they were found as possible. The gravestones found (reported in the last update) have also been recorded by the Archaeologist.

Professional tree surgeons were assigned to remove a holly that was in danger of damaging nearby walls and foundations.

Work has begun to install improved lighting which will draw attention to the church and surfacing will be laid over the next few weeks with the final finish as resin bound gravel. This is laid by hand!

Did you know...?

The entrance to Newgate near the Market Cross used to be much narrower than the present day and the view to the church mainly obscured by a couple of houses on the site which were demolished when the entrance was widened.
